The Third Antiphon, Eighth Tone
Psalm 20

Stichos 1: O Lord, in Thy strength the king shall be glad, and in Thy salvation shall he rejoice exceedingly.

Choir: Troparion - "Blessed art Thou..."

Stichos 2: The desire of his heart hast Thou granted unto him, and hast not denied him the requests of his lips.

The Small Entrance

At the Small Entrance, the Verse (said by the deacon/priest):

Be Thou exalted, O Lord, in Thy strength; we will sing and chant of Thy mighty acts. (Ps.20:13)

Then we sing the Troparion of the Feast, Glory...both now... the Kontakion.

Instead of the usual Trisagion, we sing "As many as have been baptized..."
